Why international cooperation?





"To provide for and promote, for exclusively peaceful purposes, cooperation among European states in space research and technology and their space applications."

Article 2 of ESA Convention

We **strongly** encourage international cooperation amongst entities in PECS / AM / NMS.

Encouraging international cooperation



Many countries have a funding scheme dedicated to raising technology capabilities.

- Focus is on products and services (upstream and downstream)
- Developing niche products / Europeanisation is encouraged
- Prime must be entity from that country
- YOUR participation as sub-contractor is **PAID** by the scheme (up to 20% spend outside the country) so it is give and take. Develop sensible relationships then include them in your activities and be included in theirs.
- Typical contract value is 150 400K€

Proposals leading to a potential **long term benefit** (i.e. a product or service included in a supply chain or likely inclusion in a consortium for further work not paid by this scheme) are **very strongly favoured**.

How can you be included?



ROLES

International sub-contractors in PECS/ NMS/ IIS (and Croatia) typically have one of the following roles:

- Customer role: Defining requirement, participating in reviews, performing customer level tests
- **Partner role**: Performing a part of the work (that does not generate IPR), working on a joint project (e.g. regionalising and reselling for EO applications, allowing re-use of methods and techniques, expanding test area, preventing 'reinventing the wheel'...)
- **Supplier role**: Providing a module/ equipment/ part/ service to your project
- Consultant role: Providing review help and advice and/or PA/QA mentoring
- Testing role: Performing some of the testing
