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TSI at a glance

- The Technical Support Instrument (TSI) is the EU programme that provides tailor-made technical expertise to EU Member States to design and implement reforms
- The support is demand driven and does not require co-financing from Member States
- Since 2017 technical expertise has been provided to help design and implement more than 1400 reform projects*
- It is an important pillar of the Next GenerationEU recovery and resilience plan - to help Member States mitigate the economic and social consequences of the outbreak of the COVID-19 crisis

The Technical Support Instrument at a glance

Key features of the programme

Starts with a request for support from an EU Member State

Strengthens the capacity of an EU Member State to carry out reforms

Is tailor-made to address the country's needs

Provides a unique combination of expertise from the European Commission, EU Member States' national administrations, international organisations and/or the private sector

Requires **no co-financing** from Member States


Multi-country
