

CY RRP includes a coherent package of budgeted reforms and public investment projects to be implemented by 2026 and effectively address:


- √ The key challenges identified by the European Commission for EU economies, in the context of the European Semester, particularly those identified in the Country Reports and the Country-specific recommendations.

Component 4.1 - Upgrade infrastructure for connectivity

Support an Inclusive Digital Transformation

- Address infrastructure challenges in the area of data connectivity
- Enhance access to communication infrastructure for all citizens
 - > C4.1R1: Empower the National Regulatory Authority (OCECPR)
 - C4.1R2: Empower the National Broadband Competence Office (DEC)
 - ✓ M#216 Entry into force of the administrative acts for very high capacity networks' deployment, by Q2 ≥ 2024
 - C4.1I1: Expansion of Very High-Capacity Networks in underserved areas
 - ✓ M#217 Start (signature of contracts) of very high capacity networks' deployment in underserved areas, by Q4 2024
 - ✓ T#218 & 219 Expansion and completion of very high capacity networks' deployment in underserved areas (covering at least 10,000 premises by Q4 2024 & 44,000 premises by Q4 2025, in targeted areas)
 - > C4.112: Enhance building cabling to be "Gigabit-ready" and promote connectivity take-up
 - ✓ T#220 & 221 Expansion and completion of intra-building Gigabit-ready cabling (support provision of Gigabit connection in at least 24,300 homes by Q2 2023 & 82,000 homes by Q2 2025)



CY RRF disbursements plan




The implementation of the RRP

Progress, challenges and next steps

Progress in the Implementation of the RPP

- ✓ Important Reforms have been promoted either through the entry into force of Laws and Regulations or through Council of Ministers' Decisions (administrative acts being finalized under C4.1R2)
- ✓ Public investments are underway through calls procured, number of contracts signed and some projects already under construction or completed (tender documents prepared under C4.1R2)
- ✓ Call for proposals for a significant number of grant schemes have been announced (call announced in Feb 2023 under C4.712)

CY 1st Payment Request- €85 mln




<u>Implementation of the RPP-</u> <u>Challenges</u>

- ✓ Cost Increase significant price increases in construction materials
- ✓ Supply chain challenges- significant delays in the delivery of products and raw materials
- ✓ Limited resources (management, implementation, absorption)
- ✓ Political challenges need for a consensus for the adoption of reforms
- ✓ Culture- need for a **change in culture** for the effective implementation of reforms

Implementation of the RPP-Next Steps

- ✓ New REPowerEU chapter in the RPP
- ✓ Amendment of existing measures of the RRP to tackle problems in implementation (removing measures, reducing or modifying targets, shifting timelines)
- ✓ **Submission of 2nd and 3rd payment** requests following the approval of the amendment of the Cyprus RRP by the Commission

The new REPowerEU chapter



Amendment of the RRP

RRP Downwards Revision (-£90ml.)

Amend RRP, on the basis of (a) reduction of RRF financial allocation for Cyprus (Art. 18 (2) or (b) due to objective circumstances (Art. 21):

- Remove measures
- Shift timelines of milestones and targets
- Modify / reduce targets

Introduce a new REPowerEU Chapter:

- Scale-up current RES & energy efficiency schemes (e.g. households, LAs)
- Scale-up e-mobility schemes
- New reforms for energy / RES communities and emobility charging
